



Author meetings

Make the most of this unique experience with your students when they win certificates on the live forum!



Check your email during the live book event. You will receive a notification and certificate if any of your students get an award for their contributions on the forum. Once the book is finished, you will receive an invitation to the meeting.



Print the certificate for each student who wins an award. Check your email because we will have sent you the document. **We would love for you to share it on social media** to gain more visibility. A total of 50 diplomas are issued per book.



Encourage your student to come ready to talk, and ask them to prepare **two questions for the author:** they can be about their career, their works, their interests, or the co-created book... The author will always respond enthusiastically.



Explain to your student how important it is to take advantage of this opportunity to speak with the author, and the value of the co-creation process of a Fiction Express story. Your student has been chosen among thousands of readers.



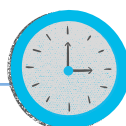
Make sure your student puts their first and last name in the Zoom window. That way, we will know they are present and can give them the opportunity to participate. If they can't do this, they can still share it in the chat during the meeting.



During the meeting, please **use the chat to inform us** about any technical issues, if you're leaving, or to write your question if the microphone isn't working. Someone from Fiction Express is always monitoring this space and can assist you.



Livestream the meeting in class. Although only the student who has won an award can participate, it's an experience that the others will never forget! **If only the winning student joins, accompany them** and enjoy the meeting together.



Please try to be flexible regarding timing: the session will start on time, but the end is less certain; it may run a few minutes longer than expected. Our priority is that all participants have the opportunity to speak.



Create activities around the meeting to reflect on what has taken place. The interaction between students and the author leads to questions, themes, answers, and dynamics that are all useful for further development further in class.
